History

The California Cancer Registrars Association, Inc. (CCRA) is a statewide organization of health professionals in cancer data management. CCRA was founded in June 1973. It has four component chapters:

- Southern California Cancer Registrars Association (SCCRA)
- Northern California Cancer Registrars Association (N-CCRA)
- San Diego County Cancer Registrars Association (SDCCRA)
- Central California Cancer Registrars Association (C-CCRA)

The Association has grown from a small group of dedicated cancer registrars to approximately 400 members. The continued growth of CCRA is secured by members who believe in its purpose.
